GENERAL INFO

We accept the following recyclables for <u>free</u>: <u>Appliances</u> - all except freon appliances. See reverse panel for freon appliance fees. <u>Automotive</u> - anti-freeze, batteries, motor oil, and oil filters.

<u>Cardboard</u> - dry food boxes, corrugated containers, food cartons (milk, juice, soy, soup). <u>Glass</u> - bottles and jars (containers like Pyrex and drinking glasses are not recyclable). <u>Household</u> - clothing, shoes, towels, bedding, and small rugs can be placed in Wearever bins at the collection sites.

Metals - aluminum and bi-metal (steel + aluminum) cans, and scrap metal. Aluminum/bi-metal cans and metal bottle caps are to be recycled with plastics, *not* with scrap metal.

<u>Paper</u> - mail and envelopes (including envelopes with windows), newspaper, brown paper, phonebooks, paperback books, etc. **Plastics** - #1, 2 and 5 containers and lids.

Yard waste - grass clippings, leaves, brush and woody wastes < 2" diameter, etc.

Other items are accepted for a fee.

Non-recyclables can be disposed of for a fee or in prepaid, colored Pepin County garbage bags (15 gallon purple and 30 gallon orange) available for purchase at the collection sites and stores throughout the county.

Two electronics recycling events are held each year, typically in the spring and fall.

Collection sites do not accept electronics.

Two Hazardous Waste and Pharmaceutical Clean Sweep events are held each year, typically in the spring and fall, in Ellsworth with the Pierce County Recycling Department.

Collection sites do not accept hazardous waste (paints, chemicals, etc.)

If you cannot make it to a Clean Sweep, expired, unwanted or unused medications can be brought to the Sheriff's Department dispatch center (740 7th Ave W, Durand).

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

<u>Cardboard</u> - clean, free of debris and flattened.

<u>Cans</u> - rinsed clean of product residue, well-drained, and recycled with plastics (<u>not scrap metal</u>).

Glass - only bottles and jars are recyclable. Rinse containers before recycling. Place metal bottle caps with plastics and cans.

<u>Plastics</u> - #1, 2, and 5 containers and lids should be rinsed clean of product residue, well-drained and flattened. Place caps back on containers after flattening. We <u>do not</u> recycle plastic bags, flowerpots, pails/buckets/barrels, coolers, etc. Please consider shopping with re-usable canvas bags and re-purposing plastic items we currently don't recycle.

Paper - clean and free of non-paper items.

Batteries to be Recycled

Automotive batteries, alkaline manganese (rechargeable), lithium/lithium ion, nickel-cadmium (rechargeable), and sealed lead acid (rechargeable). Ask a site attendant where the batteries should be disposed.

Batteries for the Trash

Button, alkaline (manganese), carbon zinc, zinc-air, silver oxide, and mercury oxide.

Wisconsin has no legal requirements for disposing of household dry-cell batteries which include AAA, AA, A, B, C, D, and 9 volt.

Note: Several department stores will take back used batteries at their photo department. Ask if yours does.
